When applying, please select the specific clubs, days and time slots which suit your availability and location. If your application is successful, you will be allocated **one** of these.

Each club has different volunteering needs, therefore the more slots you are available for, the more likely we can allocate you a place. Once matched, unfortunately we are unable to reallocate you if your chosen slot no longer suits.

As clubs offer in-person support for young people, you must be able to make your own way to the Homework Club location.
